Because school refusal behavior is a serious and debilitating problem, proper assessment and treatment of these youths is critical. Unfortunately, the field has been fractured by a lack of theoretical focus as well as various terms and clinical strategies that apply to some but not all youths of this population.

School refusal occurs when a student will not go to school or frequently experiences severe distress related to school attendance. Comprehensive treatment of school refusal, including psychiatric and medical evaluation when appropriate, is important since studies show that psychiatric disorders are the cause for a large percentage of students who fail to complete high school in the United States.

The functional assessment of school refusal behavior.

Assessment aims to (1) confirm that the behavior represents school refusal as opposed to truancy or legitimate absence, (2) evaluate the extent and severity of absenteeism, (3) the type(s) and severity of emotional distress, (4) obtain information regarding the child, family, school, and community factors that may be contributing to the behavior, and (5) use the information obtained to develop ...
